Ed. Note: With appreciation to Dr. Frank Wyman, whose interest in safety at C.S.C. is well-known.

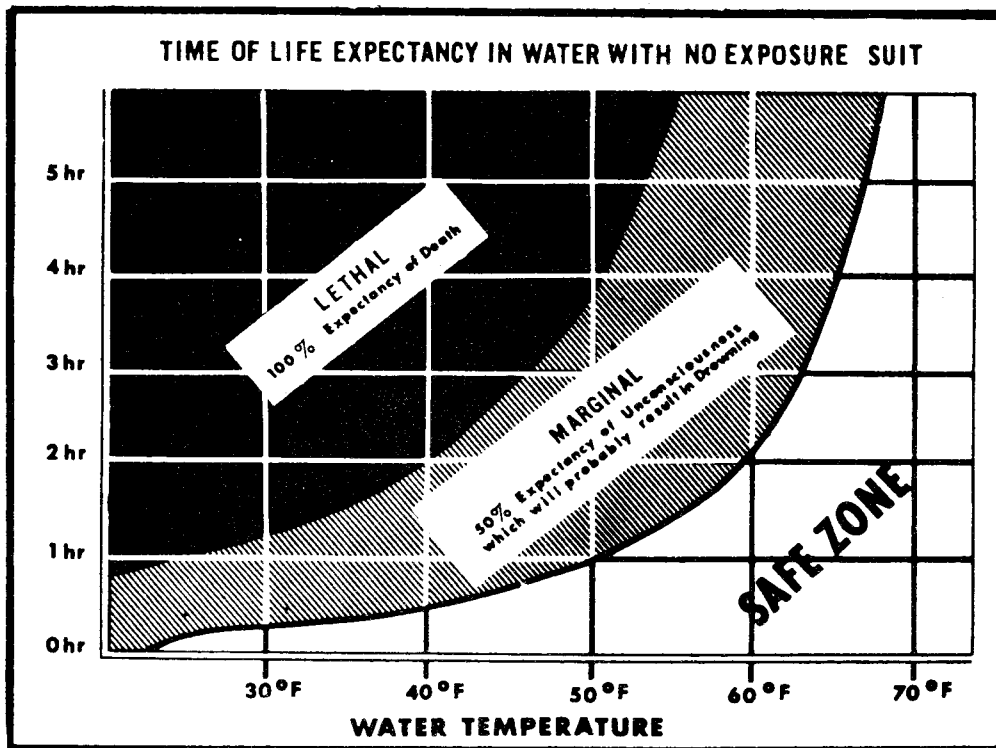

SUBJECT: Cold Water Survival Time.

We believe there are many new boat owners who are unaware of the great hazard to humans in Cold water exposure. In the interest of increased safety in the waters in and around the Atlanta area, this letter is being sent to local yacht clubs and marinas for publication on their bulletin boards for all to see and study.

The following chart is self explanatory. Please note your chances for survival are measurably reduced after 15 minutes in 30° F. water, 28 minutes at 40° F. and 55 minutes at 50° F. These figures based on World War 11 experiences in the U.S.Navy.

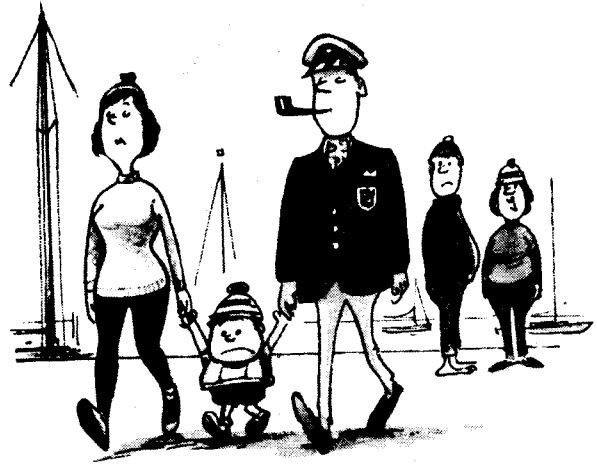
Fig. 1.—Graph of time of life expectancy in water with no exposure suit. Chart used by U.S. Navy.
