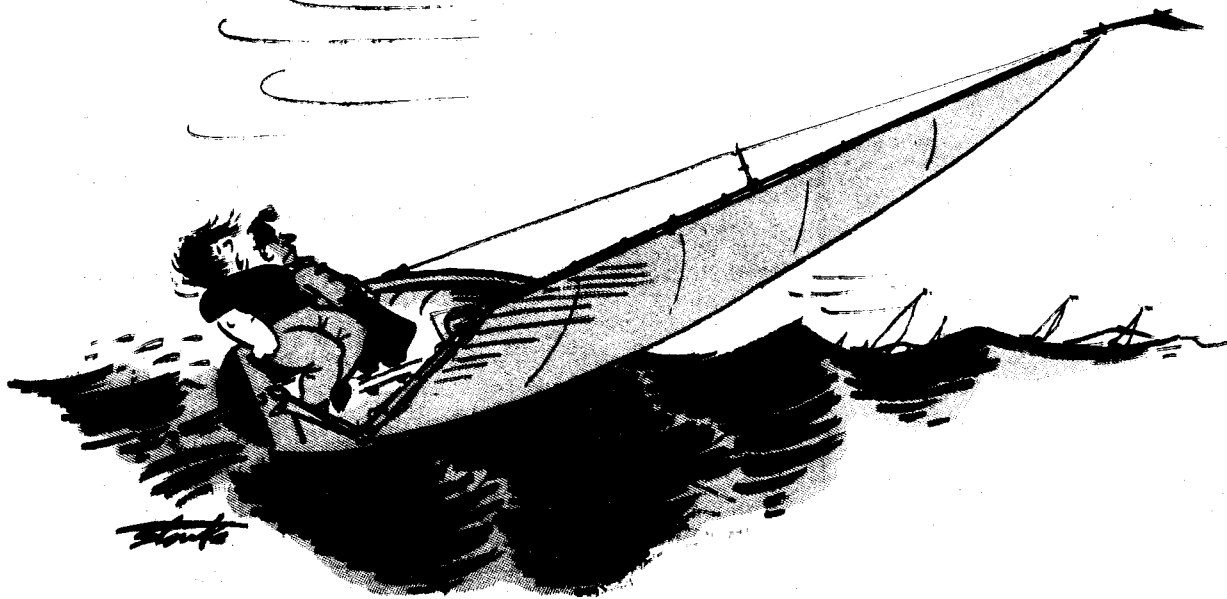

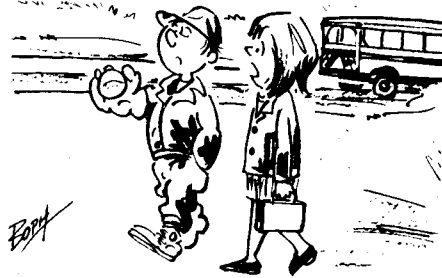

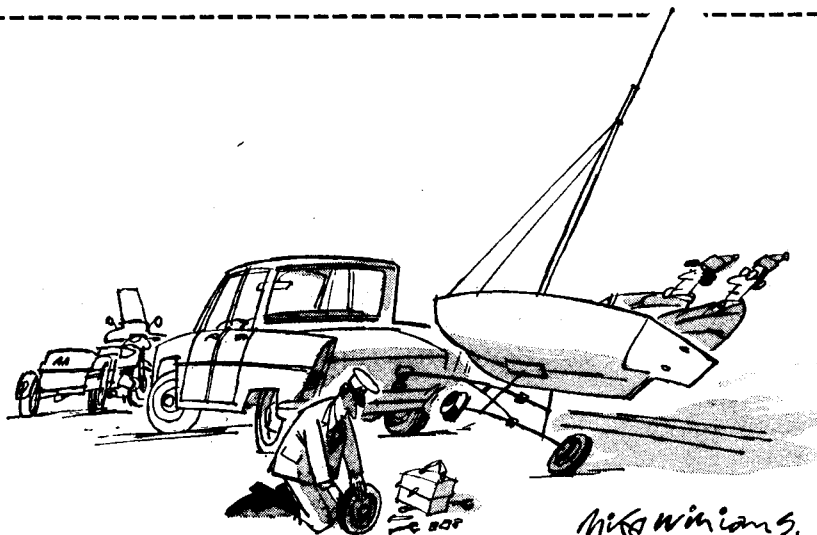
Surely we can be friends, even if my parents sail a Y-Flyer and yours a Lightning!

The girls are ready and waiting for the Ladies Sailing Classes to begin on Wednesday, June 9th, at 6:00 P.M.

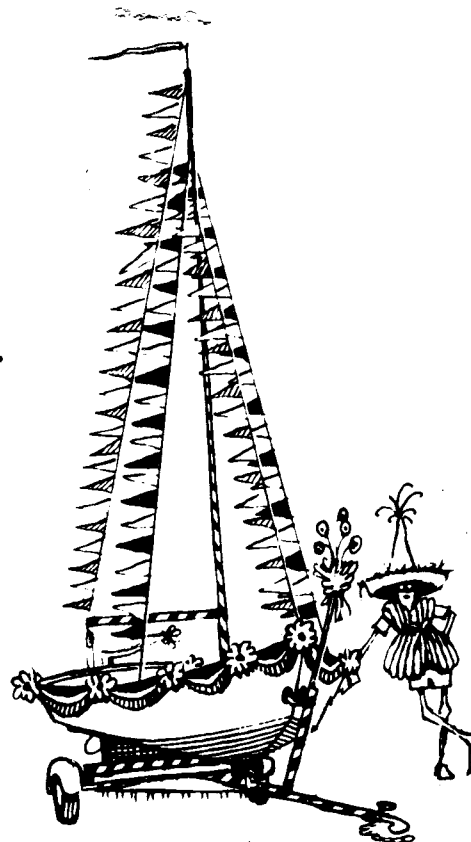
The classes will be conducted in Sunfish.. and most participants bring a picnic supper and the family.
