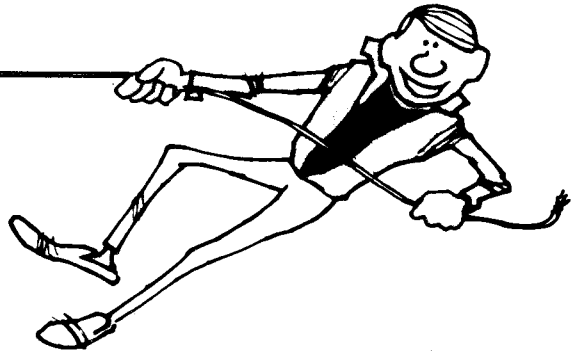

We are all needed in one way or another.. Men.. call Charles Byers if you will help in any capacity. 787-3921.

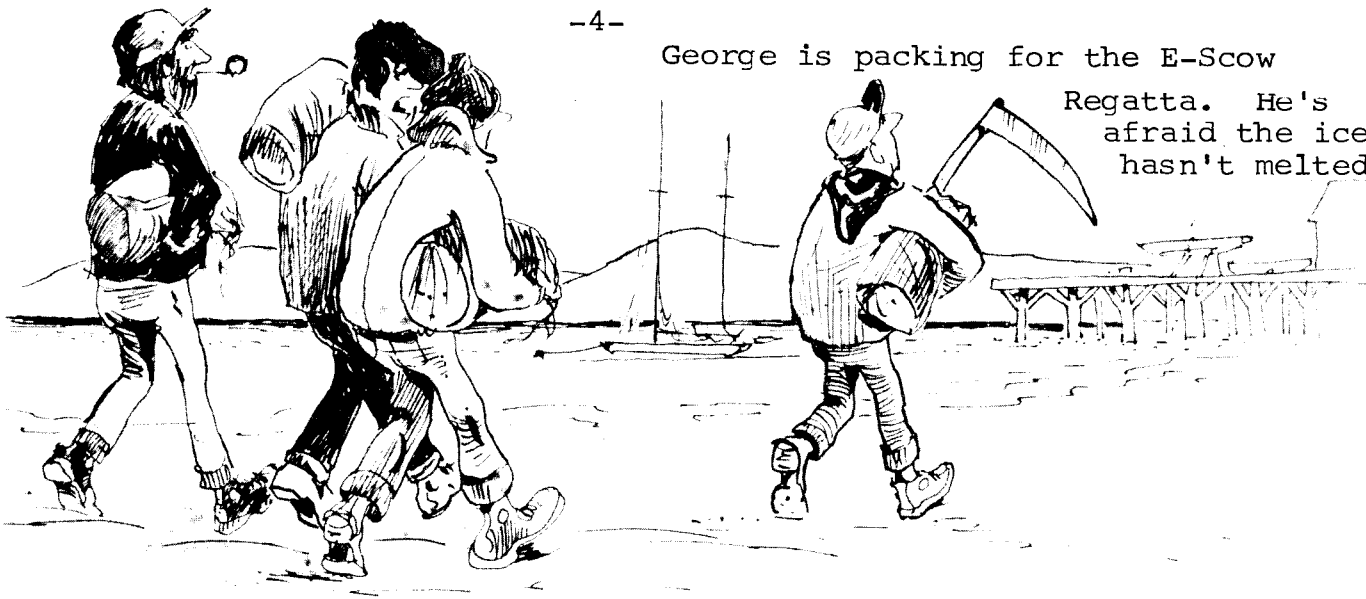

PARTIES: This may be your first Christmas party for the '75 calendar.. CSC - Forest Lake Club.. Dec. 12, 1975.

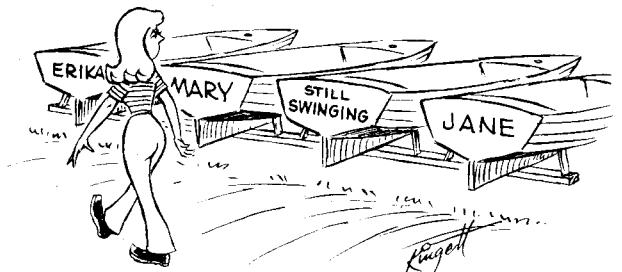
