CSC SKIPPERS SCORE IN FALL SERIES

Columbia Sailing Club skippers captured 8 of the 18 awards in the Fall Regatta of the Lake Murray Cruising Fleet. And on Friday night, January 18, it was a steady stream of those proud skippers who walked up to receive the majority of silver and crystal from LMCF Captain Al Whitworth and MORC Fleet Captain Bobby Dial.

What started out as a 10-race series ended up with 8 races sailed and 2 cancelled due to a lack of that invisible motion lotion. Boats and skippers had to have sailed a minimum of 6 races to qualify for awards.

A total of 104 boats registered for the series with 49 sailing the 6-race minimum to qualify for trophies. About 60 to 70 boats made it to the starting line each Saturday.

The LMCF Spring Regatta, another 10-race series, will begin Feb. 16, and will be raced each Saturday, except Easter weekend, with the 10-minute warning gun scheduled to be fired at 12:50 p.m. for the 1:00 p.m. screaming start.

While the Lake Murray Cruising Fleet is independent of either the Columbia Sailing Club or the Lake Murray Sailing Club, each Club gives the Fleet strong support in order to advance competitive sailing on the lake. Many of the Fleet members are non-affiliated with either Club. Membership is open to any skipper of a racing cruiser on payment of Fleet dues. (see Racing results on Page 2)



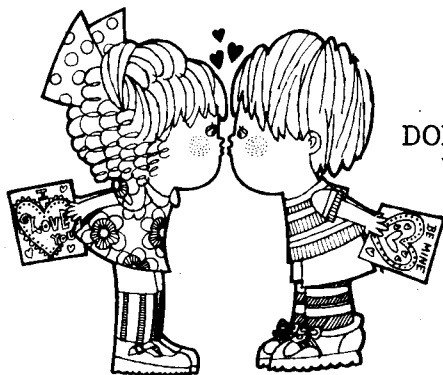
